## CDFA Releases Redevelopment Financing Recommendations for South Santa Fe Business Park

### —*CDFA Brownfields Technical Assistance Program*—

Columbus, OH – The Council of Development Finance Agencies (CDFA) staff and technical assistance providers traveled to Sheridan, Colorado to provide recommendations for financing the infrastructure improvements of a 206-acre industrial business park where no common water or sewer infrastructure has ever been installed. The team toured the project site and held meetings with several local officials and stakeholders.

“The South Santa Fe Business Park is home to some very successful businesses whose growth is limited due to lack of physical infrastructure including water, sewer, and adequate roads. We are very pleased to make financing recommendations that we believe will help to move this important project forward.” said Emily Moser, Program Manager for CDFA’s Brownfields Technical Assistance Program.

The City of Sheridan is working closely with existing property owners to find solutions. City Manager Devin Granbery remarked, “CDFA brought the expertise and experience we needed to help us identify and evaluate financing strategies for [the] project.”
