



## Frequently Asked Questions about the Brownfields Project Marketplace

### **What is the Brownfields Project Marketplace?**

The Marketplace is an open forum that connects communities looking to finance brownfield redevelopment projects with development financiers and brownfield project experts. Through the Marketplace, communities can engage in open discussion with experts, get answers to their financing questions, and come away with a better understanding of the resources available for their redevelopment projects.

Communities are asked to prepare a brief presentation on their redevelopment project and present it to our technical assistance partners in exchange for financing recommendations.

### **What can I expect as a community presenting at the CDFA Brownfields Project Marketplace?**

The Marketplace provides access to experienced technical assistance advisors, information on available financial resources for brownfields projects, and access to a network of individuals and organizations that may provide advice and insight gained from years of experience with varied redevelopment projects.

Unlike other technical assistance available to brownfield communities, the Marketplace is primarily focused on the financing component of brownfields redevelopment and connecting participating communities to financial resources. The intended outcome of participating in the Marketplace is to help identify potential resources your community can use to fill the financing gap of your project as well as:

- Discover financial resources
- Have direct access to financial advisors and brownfield experts
- Develop a better understanding of how to move your project forward
- 30 minutes dedicated to promoting your project (10 minutes of presentation time, 20 minutes of feedback from our advisors)

### **Is there a cost associated to register or attend the Marketplace?**

No, the Marketplace is FREE brownfields financing technical assistance. The Marketplace is one component of the [CDFA Brownfields Technical Assistance Program](#), which is funded by a grant from the U.S. EPA to provide FREE assistance to communities throughout the country that are looking to finance the redevelopment of brownfield sites.

### **Does CDFA have funding for projects?**

CDFA does not provide direct project funding or financing. Many of our technical assistance advisors are the financiers of development projects and can assist communities in understanding the resources and financing tools available.

### **How does the Marketplace work?**

There are two different formats of the Marketplace that CDFA conducts:

The *Online Marketplace* is conducted using online meeting software. Communities present their project online to an audience of advisors, experts, and other participating communities. Presentations are immediately followed by advisor recommendations and discussion related to the project financing. Online Marketplace sessions are 30 minute sessions, allowing approximately 10 minutes for presentations and 20 minutes for recommendations and related discussion.

The *In-Person Marketplace* takes place at various locations throughout the country. The In-Person Marketplaces can require travel on the part of the community, but offer unique opportunities for face-to-face technical assistance and networking.

### **Is my brownfield project a good fit for the Marketplace?**

We encourage all communities with brownfields to apply, though our expertise is best designed to assist redevelopment projects that have identified end uses for the site. It's helpful to have environmental assessments completed and redevelopment costs identified. If you are unsure about your projects status, CDFA staff would be happy to discuss your project and whether it would be a good fit for the Marketplace. Please contact a CDFA staff member below.

### **What format should we use for the presentation?**

PowerPoint slides are the preferred method for the presentations. We ask communities to prepare [posters](#) for the in-person marketplace events, in addition to or in place of slides.

### **What information about my project should my presentation include?**

- Basic site information (location, former use, contamination)
- Site Ownership
- Where does your project stand in the remediation/cleanup process?
- Intended future use of the site
- Have you identified your financing gap? If so, how much?
- Is your project located near existing infrastructure? (highways, rail, anchored businesses or industry)

*Additional information about your project that is helpful, but not required:*

- Financial pro-forma
- Market or feasibility study

### **How long should my presentation be?**

Each community will have 10 minutes to present their project during the Marketplace. We advise using 3-5 slides (excluding pictures and maps) for the content and background of your project.

### **How many advisors will be present for my presentation?**

We typically have 2-3 advisors present for each presentation. This number provides communities with valuable, focused feedback and avoids cluttered discussions.

### **Who are the technical assistance advisors?**

Our advisors are industry leaders that have worked with brownfield projects such as lawyers, bankers, consultants, and financial advisors.

### **My community presented our brownfield project at the Marketplace, now what?**

CDFA staff works diligently to match communities with advisors, we encourage conversations to continue outside the Marketplace. CDFA will provide both parties with necessary contact information.

In addition, for communities that participate in the Project Marketplace and want additional assistance for their brownfield efforts, the CDFA Brownfields Project Response Teams will conduct site visits providing one-on-one recommendations from a combination of CDFA staff and technical assistance partners. These fact finding visits will offer communities specific, actionable advice that can transform brownfields into usable sites. CDFA will coordinate 36 Brownfields Project Response Teams over the life of the five-year program. An example of our previous site visit reports can be viewed [here](#).
