

NTIA Tribal Broadband Connectivity Program







Overview

The TBCP is a federal program that provides grants to eligible tribal entities to expand access to and adoption of broadband service on tribal land and to promote the use of broadband to access remote learning, telework, or telehealth resources.

Program goals:

- To expand access to and adoption of broadband service on tribal land
- To promote the use of broadband to access remote learning, telework, or telehealth resources

Eligibility

Eligible applicants:

- Tribal Governments
- Tribal Colleges or Universities
- The Department of Hawaiian Home Lands on behalf of the Native Hawaiian Community, including Native Hawaiian Education Programs
- Tribal organizations
- Alaska Native Corporations

Additional information:

- Each eligible entity must coordinate internally to submit a single application.
- In an instance where one eligible entity is a subsidiary of another (e.g., a Tribal Government and a subsidiary Tribal College or University), this shall not affect the subsidiary's eligibility to submit its own application, so long as it includes the requisite Tribal Government Resolution.
- Eligible entities that previously received TBCP grant funding may apply for additional grant funding pursuant to this NOFO.

Conclusion

A wide range of tribal entities are eligible to apply for the TBCP, including Tribal Governments, Tribal Colleges or Universities, Tribal organizations, and Alaska Native Corporations. Eligible entities must coordinate internally to submit a single application. Subsidiaries of eligible entities may also apply, so long as they include the requisite Tribal Government Resolution. Eligible entities that previously received TBCP grant funding may apply for additional grant funding.
