She is responsible for developing innovative financing programs for low-and-moderate income earners to access affordable capital to make sustainable home improvements, based on ability to repay rather than credit scores. As an advocate for women's empowerment, Duanne founded a non-profit organization in Florida to help women victims of abuse, violence, and poverty create and finance their small businesses.
